STOCK COMPETITION

A team from Farmington High School competing in a stock market simulation finished in first place in a regional competition and seventh in the state.

Team captain Jeham Tahla and members Adam Hibbs and Sherri Robinson took part in the stock market game in Bernard Call's class, where they were given a simulated account of \$100,000 and could trade in stocks on the New York, American and over-the-counter exchanges.

The students traded primarily in Broad Inc., Hartmark Corp., Homedex Corp. and Zenith Electronics Corp. and accumulated a portfolio value of \$120,225 after five weeks.

The game is sponsored through the Michigan Economic Education Council and co-sponsored by the Detroit Free Press, Roney & Company, the Securities Traders Association of Detroit and its state affiliate and the Central States District of the Securities Industries Association.

The team wins a Detroit Economic Club luncheon and tours at the Free Press, Roney and the Federal Reserve Branch Bank in Detroit. They will receive further recognition at the Securities Traders Association Banquet in 1991.





As of December 4, if the first three digits of your phone number are listed below, you must dial "1-313" when dialing long distance within the 313 area. Otherwise, your call won't be connected. Because that's when final conversion of your neighborhood to "1-313" long distance dialing will be complete. So if you haven't already reprogrammed your speed calling, call forwarding, modem communications software and auto-

matic dialers, you should do so immediately.

And remember, local and zone calls are still seven digits. Not sure what's long distance and what's not? Just check the front of your Ameritech PagesPlus White Pages directory.

Thanks for dialing "1-313" Because by doing it you're helping to create 1.5 million new phone numbers for our area. And a completed call for yourself.
