Softball tournaments coming

Over 3,000 Amateur Softball Association (A.S.A.) players from around the nation will fill local baseball diamonds and hotel rooms in 1991 and 1992 when Troy, Rochester and Novi host two major U.S. championship tournaments.

A group of local hoteliers, Metropolitan Detroit Chapter A.S.A. officials and the Metropolitan Detroit Convention & Visitors Bureau have convinced national A.S.A. officials to hold the 1991 Women's Major Slowpitch Amateur Championship and the 1992 Men's Master 35 & Over Slowpitch Amateur Championship tournaments in metro Detroit.

More than 75 teams, umpires and A.S.A. officials will visit the area in 1991 and 1992 for the tournaments.

The women's tournament will be played at Power Park in Novi from Aug. 29 through Sept. 2, 1991, while the men's games will take place Sept. 3 through 7, 1992 at Flynn Park in Troy, and the Rochester Hills Sports Complex which will open in 1991.
