

Tourney experience gives Falcons boost

"I think we're on the edge and hopefully ready to push it over and get that idea 'Yeah, we can be successful.'"

FARMINGTON

A strong showing in the Harrison tournament last month did wonders for the Falcons' confidence, according to first-year coach Julie Ingalls.

Farmington reached the semifinals and ended up fourth, but it was a positive step for a program adjusting to its third coaching change in four years.

"When things went well in the first tournament, (the players) were surprised by that," Ingalls said. "But they liked it, and they've been working hard to keep that feeling. That saw they can play with other teams."

That immediate boost in confidence helped Ingalls, who coached the JV team at North Farmington the last four years, to teach her players the benefit of positive thinking.

"That was the main thing," she said. "At the beginning, they had the skills."

"The mental picture was the big thing. If they hit the ball into the net, they kept seeing themselves hitting into the net. I tell them to see themselves hitting aces or kills."

Ingalls, a 1981 graduate of Farmington, said she sought the job because she was ready to coach a varsity team of her own.

"Working with (North coaches) Sandy and Norm Lukowski was a great experience. They taught me a lot, and it was time to try something new."

The Falcons return six players, all

seniors, in Kristy Bodary, Jennifer Derwinski, Kerri Finlayson, Patti Hansen, Kim Owczarzak and Beth Schneider. But juniors Candice Enerio, Sue Gibson, Rebekah King and Debbie Schroeder also will have key roles.

The four hitters in Farmington's 4-2 lineup will be Hansen, King, Gibson and Schroeder. This is Gibson's first year of volleyball, but no one can tell the difference, Ingalls said. Schroeder is a transfer from Taylor Truman where she played varsity.

"The best thing they have going for them is they're real aggressive and go after everything," Ingalls said. "Patti and Rebekah are real strong hitters, and Sue and Debbie are consistent hitters."

"And we're lucky to have four setters, so we can get a rest for every body. I saw that was important in the tournament."

Finlayson and Owczarzak will be the starting setters with sophomore Michelle Lorenz and junior Amy Sosnowski in reserve.

"Both have good court sense and work real hard to get to the ball," said Ingalls of Finlayson and Owczarzak. "They work well with the hitters, asking them where they want the ball. Beth can set from the front or back row."

The plan calls for Enerio and Schneider, a pair of back-row specialists, to substitute for Hansen and King when they rotate to the rear.

Gibson and Schroeder are all-round players. Bodary will get a lot of playing time, being able to sub for players in the front or back.

Derwinski and fellow senior Cory Wojak are hitters. Junior Tiffany Kaloustian is another all-round player. The Falcons return to action Monday at Northville.

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that the Farmington Hills City Council will give formal consideration to a proposed text amendment of the Farmington Hills City Code, Chapter 24, Zoning Chapter, which amendment will amend Section 24-3-2. A summary of said amendment is as follows:

1. Amend Section 24-3 - Housing for the Elderly

Housing for the elderly means two (2) or more living units within a building designed especially for the use and occupancy of elderly persons, married or single. Elderly persons will be defined as individuals who have attained the age of fifty-five (55) years or couples of which either the husband or wife has attained the age of fifty-five (55) years.

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that the Farmington Hills City Council will give formal consideration to a proposed text amendment of the Farmington Hills City Code, Chapter 24, Zoning Chapter, which amendment will amend Section 24-436 (a), to amend the Preamble for the Industrial Research Office zoning district. A summary of said amendment is as follows:

(a) The IRO industrial research office districts are designed to provide for uses which are office or research type or industrial uses which have limited impact outside of the industrial building. The district is designed to be used in areas which are not adjacent to lands indicated as residential on the city's master plan. The district is intended to encourage uses which have a high value per acre of land that will supplement the city's tax base. Certain businesses are permitted within office buildings as secondary uses.

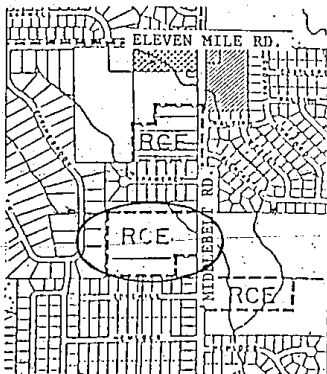
