A search for employment ensued for six months. Stand-up comedy was a viable alternative. Anthony tried his luck at an open mike night at the Comedy Castle.

"It was very liberating I enjoyed working in radio. I wanted to experience more of the limelight.

izations. Anthony draws his stage friends from everyday life. "To flesh out a character, they have to become three-dimensional. You have to have a background and make up a history of this character." Like B.B. Chang, for instance. Anthony saw a pair of Oriental guys singing and the idea of a Chinese blues singer came about.
