PRESENT: Harbuck, McShane, Tupper, Voder.

ABSENT: Richardson.

OTHERS PRESENT: City Manager Deadman, Director Layloff, City Attorney Donohue, Adm. Assistant Schultz, City Clerk Bushey. Minutes of the previous meeting of December 17, 1990, were approved as written.

Minutes of other Boards were received and/or filed.

Council granted a 6-month sign variance to Oak Farms Market.

Council received and filed the notice of transfer of SDM and SMD licenses from Cambridge Drug, Inc. to Maple Drug Stores, Inc.

Council approved the 1991 Boys State program and appointed Councilwoman McShane as the boy's contact person.

Council received the City Manager's report on the notice of Detroit water and sewer rate increase.

Council adopted the following resolutions:

- Approving transfer of \$28,300.00 of Economic Development Corporation funds and \$122,000.00 from General Fund balance to the Capital Improvement Fund.
- Approving additional expenditure for Farmington Museum road repair and authorizing payment of \$9,477.50 to Oak Builders, Inc.

Council introduced Ordinance No. C-579-91 which would amend Section 31.320 of the City Code, Designated Parking Areas.

Council received the City Attorney's report on pending litigation.

Public comments were heard.

Monthly bills were approved for payment.

Meeting adjourned at 9:33 p.m.

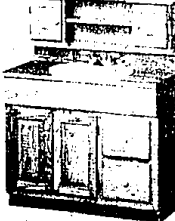
