deputy public safety director Gary Goss said police took the matter se-riously, especially in light of the war in the Middle East and the cultural mix of the student population at the high school. One of the young men was reportedly of Arab descent.

STUDENTS apparently overheard Saddam's Number One."

Police believe the two may have hought they could prompt school officials to evacuate and close the chool.

School officials and Farmington's The school was not evacuated, be-

cause students alerted administrators to the situation and police were
called.

"Given the situation, it was potentailly dangerous," said Gos. "It was
clearly raising the emotional level of
the students. We feel it's a serious
offense."

Petitions have been filed with the
Oakland County Prosecutor's office
determine if the two will face
charges. Farmington High School
principal Ceral Potter said the two
boys were suspended and that an investigation was continuing.


