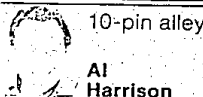
The announcers are Chris Schenkel and Nelson Burton Jr. They have been doing a fine job for many years.

Kahn paces North gymnastics win

Senior Heather Kahn scored a 35.35 in all-around competition Thursday to lead the North Farmington gymnastics team to a victory over visiting Berkley.

The Raiders, 4-2 in dual meets, scored 118.9 and the Bears 92.9.

Besides being the top all-arounder, Kahn was first on the uneven parallel bars (8.05), floor exercise (8.95) and balance beam (8.8). She placed second on vault with an 8.55 score.

North teammate Jameelah Gater was the vault winner with an 8.7 score. She also was second on floor (8.5), third on bars (8.5) and beam (7.15).

Also finishing among the top three in individual events for the Raiders were Michelle Tsai, who was second on bars (8.55) and beam (7.8), and Cara Pool, who was third on floor (7.3).

CLARENCEVILLE raised its dual-meet gymnastics record to 6-2 Wednesday with a win over host Wayne Memorial. The Lady Trojans compiled a team score of 111.6 and the Zebras 84.1.

Kelly Jacobs won two events for the Zebras, but Clarenceville had better depth.

Jacobs was first on bars (7.85) and floor (8.65), and she had the best all-around score at 32.85. Jacobs also was second on beam (8.1) and third on vault (6.25).

Clarenceville's Lisa Granfeldt was the beam winner with an 8.2 score, and Wayne's Jennifer Laskey captured top honors on vault at 8.45.

Clarenceville was runner-up in the all-around competition, scoring 32.05. She was second on vault (8.25), bars (7.2) and floor (8.4). Laskey added a third place on beam (7.65).

Despite a determined effort by senior Eve Claar, host Livonia Stevenson beat North Farmington 15-6, 15-12, 15-9 in volleyball Wednesday.

Claar had 11 kills and 12 digs for the Raiders, who dropped to 3-2 in the Western Lakes Activities Association and 2-1 in the Lakes Division. Stevenson is 11-3-4 and 6-0 in the WLAA.

"I have nothing but big compliments for (Claar)," Stevenson coach Lee Cagle said. "She's a terrific athlete and she tried to do everything for North Farmington. They played very, very hard."

Senior outside hitter Laura Zatorski led Stevenson with 11 kills and 20 digs. Junior middle blocker Teresa Sarno had six kills, five solo blocks, three assisted blocks and 10 defensive digs, while senior outside hitter added 10 kills and 22 defensive passes.

Sarah Lungren and Karen Miller scored nine points each for North. Dana Botwick was the top server.

"We tried to be effective in the middle attack," Cagle said. "With a quick attack in the middle, we were able to get the ball back easier, and it made the outside attack much more effective."
