Rochester pianist Jim Bajor has just signed a contract with Kruse & Muer on Main Street in Rochester. Bajor appears at Kruse & Muer every

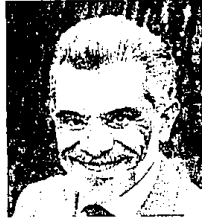
