## aw updated to protect trees

THE LAW is not as restrictive as those in other cities, such as in neighboring Farmington Hills where laws, are in place restricting removal of trees on private property. Carol furth, member of the Farmington Beautification Committee who chaired the study, said the group did not feel restrictions to private property were necessary in a city as developed as Farmington.

"It was really to protect all the public trees," she added.

The Farmington ordinance does address trees on private property, robibiliting the planting of several tree types which would be poisonous such as Cackeye, Golden Chain Tree or Horsechestanu, or those which would be a nuisance to the community such as Cackey, Golden Chain Tree or Horsechestanu, or those which would be a nuisance to the community such as Cackey, Golden Chain Tree

26 species of trees which will be considered "landmark" trees, depending on their size. Removal of landmark trees for private developments would require a site plan approval of the city's planning commission. Some highlights of the amended ordinance include:

• giving the Department of Pub-lic Services all authority to enforce the ordinance's regulations and mon-itor all public trees. • setting guidelines and a rating system for the DPS employees to judge trees in the right-of-way to determine helr health and vitality.

allowing residents, if they so wish, to remove trees from the right-of-way after obtaining a written per-mit from the city. If a resident re-moves the tree, he must replace it with one from an approved list of

tree types.

• prohibiting residents from put-ting any stone, brick, sand, concrete or other material in the right-of-way which will impede the tree's surviv-al, including polsons or toxins which might run into the tree's root sys-tem.

THE LISTS of approved and prohibited trees are lengthy, and are available through the city. The lists also offer information on tree types, such as: how susceptible they are to Gypsy Moth infestations, whether they have a road salt intolerance, recommended times of year for planting, or whether a particular species of tree requires full sun or can tolerate poorly drained soil.

Some of the approved trees for right-of-way planting include two varieties of Crabapple and Oak and

four varieties of Maple. A few prohibited trees include Birch, Black Walnut, Willow and Pine trees because of their density.

The updated ordinance is expected to make the job easier for employees in the city's public services department.

"There's still plenty of room for opinion, but what it's done is set some parameters," said assistant public services director Kevin Gushman who also served on the subcommittee studying the ordinance change. "It sets some criteria for removal and replacement.

"There was no set policy for tree removal."

Gushman said the city gets numer ous calls and questions from residents from the time trees bud in the spring until the fall, when leaves fall and trees go dormant.
