"The performance is a very important part of my life," sald Hamao Fujiwara during an interview from his Ann Arbor home.

FUJIWARA THRIVES on per-forming. His recital career has tak-en him to Western Europe, Japan, India and across the States from New York to Alaska. As recently as

"We played some Mozart in D minor," Fujiwara sald. "I really had fun."

Fujiwara sald he has been play-ing violin "almost 40 years."

Since fall 1988, Fujiwara has been a professor of violin at the University of Michigan School of Music in Ann Arbor. Before that time, he taught at the Juilliard School and the Manhattan School of

A dedicated violin instructor, Fujiwara sald he "commuted be-tween New York City and Ann Ar-bor for one year" to fulfill teaching obligations.

FUJIWARA SAID that Bela "Bartok is the only 20th century composer on the program."

Born in Hungary in 1881, Bartok fled his beloved country in 1940 at the urging of friends who feared for his safety because of his strong moral stands.

He protested the performances of his music on Berlin radio and took a stand against fascism when-ever possible. On the eve of World

War II, he came to the States and settled in New York City.

Bartok was positive what the world saw as authentic Hungarian music, romanticized by Brahms and Liszt, was essentially the mu-sic of the Gypsies.

The truth of the matter, he decided, was that Hungarian folk music lay amongst the peasants. He set out to find it. Traveling the countryside, Bartok became an authority on songs of the Danublan hasin

BARTOK FOUND authentic Hungarian folk music, based on ancient modes, nonsymmetrical rhythms and unfamiliar scales set him free. In fact, the term rhapsody as it pertains to musical compositions means, "fragmentary song," and is mainly used to designate "free fantases of a somewhat epic, heroic or national character."

Bartok's compositions consist of romantic and classic elements. A virtuoso pianist himself, Bartok is considered one of the masters of modern piano compositions.

Pianist Katsurako Mikami, also featured on the program, won both the Marguerite Long International



Competition in Paris and the Na-tional Competition in Tokyo. She attended the Toho School of Music, the Paris Conservatory of Music and the Juilliard School in New York City. Mikami records for Col-umbia and Musica Magna Records Gerova-Ortega, from Bloomfield Hills, will perform along with Fu-jiwara and Mikami. Gerova-Ortega debuted as a flu-tist at Carnegie Hall Concert in 1983. She is the artistic director of the "Musica Viva" concerts.
