Mykel T. Williamson proud of heritage

Mykel T. Williamson, who stars as persistent reporter Deacon Bridges on NBC's *Midnight Caller*, is equally persistent about his real-life career. With six regular series roles and an equal number of feature films behind him, Williamson has proven his ability for acting. And he has paired that with a prowess for dancing, singing and directing as well.

At age 13, Williamson became the youngest dancer with the Lockers dance troupe, graduating to a key dancer on *Soul Train*. His aptitude for music did not stop there, however. He

directed Reel Image's 1988 hit video *The Hypnotist*, and did background vocals for Dan Hartman's "I Can Dream About You." As manager of the rap group Movement Ex, he is preparing for the recording of the first of seven albums for Columbia.

Born in St. Louis, Mykel T. is proud of his heritage as both a Black American and a Native American. He was born Mykelti, a Blackfoot tribe phrase meaning "spirit" or "silent friend." One of his desires, he said, is to reenact the life of Stepin Fetchit, the 1930's black comedian whose exaggerated portrayal of a black man made a mockery of racial stereotypes.

"It was only with the pioneering sacrifice of some people like Fetchit who were and are regarded as Uncle Toms, that the gates were opened to minority talents in all capacities," Williamson said.
