Audrey Hepburn travels world in search of beautiful gardens

Audrey Hepburn makes one of her rare television appearances Thursday, March 7, on PBS when she hosts *Gardens of the World*. The program required extensive travel on Hepburn's part, as she ventured across the globe in search of each continent's most beautiful gardens.
