NBC to cover IAFF track, golf

Four-time NCAA champion Sury Faxon and Olympic silver medalist Greg Foster will be among the world-class athletes showcased when NBC's *SportsWorld* presents same-day coverage of the IAFF World Indoor Track and Field Championships from Seville, Spain, Sunday, March 10.

Former Olympians Willie Gault and Dwight Stoney, along with Craig Moxback and Todd Christensen, will bring highlights from selected events featuring Olympic champions and hopefuls.

Faxon, the only runner ever to win four straight NCAA titles in the 1500-meters, headlines the list of American women competing. Also competing will be Diane Dixon, the holder of nine U.S. Indoor titles in the 440-yard dash and a silver medalist at the 1989 World Games. Foster, America's top athlete in the 110-meter hurdles, will be joined by Hollis Conway, the American record holder in the high jump.

NBC will wind up a full day of Sunday sports with live final-round coverage of the Honda Golf Classic from Coral Springs, Fla. The long, 7,037-yard, par-72 course at Eagle Trace proved to be a challenge as only seven golfers broke par. One of those was John Huston, who shot a four-round score of 6-under-par 282 to gain his first PGA Tour win in his three-year pro career.
