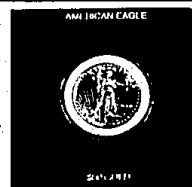
**SINGLE PLACE** meets at 7:30 p.m. Wednesday, March 27, in First Presbyterian Church, 200 E. Main St., Northville.
