Besides providing residents with a place to take household hazardous materials, the collection and disposal of the materials is an effort to protect the environment and boost recepting.

Curbside recycling and curbside composting — which will begin in Farmington Illis July 1 — also are expected to help protect the environment and reduce the waste stream. Consider that most homeowners have an average three to 10 gallons of household hazardous materials somewhere in their house, besomewher in their house, besomewher or garage, according to state Department of Natural Resources statistics.

Residents who plan to drop off their household hazardous wastes to be a few things in mind. Chemical Waste Management, which will dispose of the materials, will limit single containers of waste to a maximum five gallons of liquid or 40 pounds of solid waste.


