Though library officials are requesting the city council to reserve 10 acres of Peltz, they want to buy only the amount of land needed to accommodate the new building and parking. Papais said.

In spring 1990, the Farmington and Farmington Hills city councils — which finance the library system — voted 11-1 that building an new library was preferred over expansion. Marks cast the opposing ballot.

In November 1989, Farmington and Farmington Hills voters defeat-ed a \$14.5 million bond issue to build a new library on the north side of 12 Mile, east of Halsted.

They also defeated a request for a maximum 1.5-mill operating tax, which would have allowed the two-branch system to be financed independently of Farmington and Farmington Hills.
