vide it," she added. "I don't think parents feel welcome." She said parents are a resource which "haven't even begun to be tapped."

MYERS HAS attended school board meetings regularly throughout the past year, saying after last June's election that she intended to run again. "I would be a more hands-on school board member," she said. "I would be in and out of school buildings all the time as a parent — not just as a board member."

Myers is active in PTA, booster clubs and other parent groups. A bookkeeper with Jimco Realty, she is married and has three sons in the school system. She has lived in the district for nearly 10 years.

Also a regular at board meetings, DeVries is running a campaign focused on fiscal responsibility in district finances and better goal-setting and assessment for the district.

"I'm not putting down the district, but we've got a long way to go," said DeVries, a vocal opponent of the Feb. 5 operating millage request which was defeated at the polls. "One of the things I would do on the board is ask the tough questions that nobody asks. I think the public deserves a little more."

DeVries is a structural optimization engineer with the Ford Motor Co. and has lived in the district 11 years. He is married with three children, two attend school in the district. He served on the 1987-88 boundary study committee for Farmington schools.

Residents who haven't registered to vote for the June 10 election have

until 5 p.m. Monday, May 13 to do so. The Farmington Public School District covers the city of Farmington,

most of Farmington Hills and a small portion of West Bloomfield Township.

Walled Lake, C'ville set school elections

There is only one race in the two neighboring school districts which impact residents of Farmington Hills.

As in Farmington and other districts across the state, elections will be held June 10 in both the Walled Lake Consolidated School District and the Clarenceville School District.

In Clarenceville:

• Two incumbents and one challenger are vying for two, 4-year terms on the school board. Incumbents Vernice Dunklee and Dale Weighill face challenger Ilse Burr. All are Livonia residents.

• Incumbent Gary Gasser is running, unopposed, to complete the remainder of a term to which he was appointed.

In Walled Lake:

• Incumbents Esther McInnis and Samantha Reutenik will run unopposed for two, 4-year terms on that school board. McInnis is the current board president.

Walled Lake schools encompass students from one square mile in the northwest corner of Farmington Hills, while Clarenceville Schools educate students from a small segment of residents in the city's southeast corner.
