NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING ON INCREASING PROPERTY TAX AND PROPOSED OPERATING BUDGET

Pursuant to Public Act No. 5 of 1982 and Public Act No. 43 of 1963 (2nd Ex. Sess.), the Board of Education of Clarenceville School District will conduct public hearings on increasing property taxes for operating expenses and the proposed operating expenses and the proposed operating budget for 1991-92. The hearing will be held:

The authorized rate for operating millage in the District is 41.2552 mills. Public Act No. 5 of 1982 would limit the levy to 39.4819 mills. Section 31 of Article 9 of the Michigan Constitution would limit the levy to 41.2552 mills.

Subject to confirmation of the state equalized valuation of the School District, the Board of Education intends to levy 41.2552 mills for operating purposes. Revenues for operating purposes from ad valorem property tax levies would be increased by 4.43%.

Copies of the 1991-92 budget are available for inspection at the offices of the Board of Education. The public is invited to attend the hearings.
