You will never see a finer bunch of good-timin' fellas and good of' girls than in Meadow Brook Theatre's toe-tapping, down-home musical "Pump Boys and Dinettes."

The show mixes mellow country tunes, songs with a Nashville beat, some vintage rock in 'roll and a smattering of spirited white soul, for a wonderful evening of the music born and raised in the mid-South.

"Pump Boys and Dinettes" abounds with good humor under the direction of William Morris — from the visual humor of a deer rask hanging on the gas station wall amidst a lineup of shiny hub caps and fan belts to the verbal kind of humor in happily bokey lyries that cele-

Other songs speak of love in 1ts many guises — for a woman named Mona who works at Woolworths, for a grandma gone to her reward and for Dolty Parton by a smitten teen fan who sings "The Night Dolty Parton Was Nearly Mine."

Before showtime, four good of boys begin moseying around the gas station side of the set. They fus with cords running from the mikes, tune guitars, wipe their bands on red rags hangin out of their denlm overalls and strike up conversations with folks in the audience.

WHEN THE LIGHTS go down, the friendly fellas turn out not to be stagehands but stars of the show. Jackson (Kim Story) is the substantial gay who looks like he ate too many helpings of grandma's cornbread and molasses. Eddie (Stephen Sust) is the tactium hippide with the ponytail. Jim (Ollie O'Shea) eco-owns the station out on North Carolina Highway 37, and the nerdy L.M. (Shawn Stengel) wears, white socks with his loafers. He makes up for his

women, carry fresh-baked ples into the diner they run next door to the pump boys greasy gas station. When the music starts, they sing about food, including pecan ple (pronounced PEE-kan, with the accent on the first syllable the way folks say it in those parts). Rhetta and

kitchen paraphernalia to make a dandy percussion section, accompanying the boys on guitar, bass and plano.

And when Prudle and Rhetta pound the pans, they swing their hips and move to the music in a way that's a right pleasure to see. When they sing, the pleasure multiplies.

Forget plot in "Pump Boys." There's not much of one. Prudle is smitten by L.M.'s nergy charm. Rhetta takes a liken to Jim, and the folks out on Highway 57 know a heap of ways to have fun. That's all the plot you need to have a hand-clapp.


