County may reconsider Jewish War Vets' request

The Oakland County Board of Commissioners is expected to take a second look at a request from the Jewish War Veterans for \$5,000 to defer the cost of the organization's

other the cost of the organization's 50th anniversary.

"I think (the request) was turned down on the basis of incomplete information," said commissioner Dennis M. Aaron, D-Oak Park.

Aaron said he will ask his col-leagues to reconsider the request during today's regular meeting of the county board. The request has been approved by the board's public services committee, but turned down by the finance committee.

At issue, commissioners generally agree, is where and when the county grants money to private organizations.

The county gets requests from numerous organizations, said commissioner Nancy McConnell, ft-Bloomield Hills and vice chairman of the board. "They're all deserving," she said. "But when does the county draw the line?"
The Jewish War Veterans asked for \$5,000 to help defer costs associ-

ated with its golden anniversary eetberation in Southfield in June.

THAT REQUEST is almost identical to one received — and granted
— last year when the Military Order
of the Purple Heart held its rallonal.

But times have changed, insists
commissioner G. William Caddell,
R. Walled Lake and chairman of the
finance committee. "This is a very
tight year."

Even in good times, however,
commissioners should take a very
close — and prudent approach — to
granting such requests, said commissioner Donald W. Jensen, R. Birmingharn, a member of the finance committee who voied against the request. "It's a matter of precedent."

Aaron, however, said his colleagues should reconsider. "We
should be doing everything we can.

Aaron theorized his colleagues
voied against the request because
they are concerned all 2 of the veterans organizations in Michigan
could make similar requests— and
demand equal consideration.

Existing state law enables cities
or counties to provide public money
to chartered veterans groups holding



However, Aaron insists, "There is no danger of that happening in Oakland County." That being the case, commissioners should approve the Junding since the Jewish War Veterans is the only group to make such a request this year.

COMMISSIONER LAWRENCE R. Perrick, D-Southfield, said he favors the county granting the request from the Jewish War Veterans as a matter of uniformity. "What we do for one, we should do for all." But the (Jewish) veterans said they didn't want the request to become a big political issue," Pernick said.

Commissioner John G. Pappageorge, R-Troy, voted against the grant. He contends the appropriate way to handle such requests is during the budget process.

If a specific amount is set aside for such purposes, he said, all groups that might qualify for public lands could compete on regular footing. Correspondingly, commissioners would be obligated to review each request on the basis of merit and decide accordingly.
