2 face trial on sex charges

A suspended Detroit police officer and a Farmington Hills man will both stand trial in Oakland County Circuit Court on mulple rape charges believed to have occurred in Farminston

Many of the counts include first degree criminal sexual conduct, which involves penetration and carries a term of up to life in prison, upon conviction.

The cases against both men involve 10 years of alleged sexual assault against two Farmington girls, now young women, between 1976 and 1986. The defendants are related to the victims.
