

## Vikings topple Raiders

Walled Lake Central forced a tie with North Farmington for first place in the Lakes Division of the Western Lakes Activities Association by defeating the host Raiders 6-3 Monday in girls softball.

Both teams are 6-1 in the division. North is 13-3 overall.

Central was ahead from the start, taking a 2-0 lead in the first inning on Kelly Glennie's double. The Vikings led 4-1 after four and 5-3 after six. They collected nine hits, led by Carrie Cassinaki's 3-for-4 performance.

Jenny Czech was the winning pitcher, hurling the first five innings. Cassinaki relieved, pitching the last two.

Jennifer Lydon took the loss for North despite giving up just three earned runs. The Raiders committed four errors. Lydon fanned two and walked one batter in seven innings.

North tallied one run in the third and two in the sixth. Andrea Borleo had two of the team's three hits, and Karen Seremet had the other. The Raiders, who had the bases loaded in three innings, scored their runs on wild pitches and passed balls.

"Central came ready to play in the cold weather," North coach Dave Brubaker said, adding he thought it was a mistake to play the game under such circumstances. As the home team, North had the option of playing or postponing.

"We should have called it off and played it on a day when the weather was favorable. My girls couldn't play in the cold. I guess we're not a cold-weather team."

**FARMINGTON HILLS** Mercy swept a double-header Tuesday from perennial softball power Harper Woods Regina, forcing a tie for first place in the Central Division of the Catholic League, 5-2 and 11-2.

Both teams are 6-4 in the division. The Marlins, who won three games from Regina for the first time in six years, improved to 14-5 overall.

Maureen Paulin was the winning pitcher in both games. She pitched all seven innings in the first and 10 of the 11 in the second.

The Marlins rallied to break a 2-2 tie and win the nightcap with a nine-run 11th inning.

Mercy scored its runs on four hits — Kim Reichard had a three-run double and Paulin a two-run single — three walks and two errors. The Marlins sent 14 batters to the plate

In the first game, Mercy scored all five runs in the fourth inning. Two runs scored on Reichard's sacrifice bunt, and Maura Phoney had a two-run single.

The Marlins play a key division double-header Friday against Livonia Ladywood at Bicentennial Park.

**CORY WOJCIK** scattered five hits over six innings Tuesday while pitching Farmington to an 8-7 victory over cross-town rival Farmington Hills Harrison.

The win improved the Falcons to 8-9 overall while the Hawks dropped to 3-12.

Pauli Hansen was the starting pitcher for Farmington but gave up six runs in the first inning and gave way to reliever Wojcik, who struck out six, walked four and allowed the

Hawks only one additional run. Shelby Bouwens was the losing pitcher. Jenny Sever, Hansen and Shannon Dudley had two hits apiece for the Falcons. Sever and Hansen also drove in one run each, and Hansen and Sever scored a run.

Farmington got a run back in the third inning and also had a six-run inning in the fourth, but the Hawks tied it 7-7 in the bottom of the fourth. The Falcons got their winning run in the sixth.

"Cory really held them," Farmington coach Julie Ingalls said. "The most batters she faced in any inning was four. She came in and took charge, which kept everyone in the game."

Hansen suffered the loss for Farmington. She pitched seven innings and gave up five walks and eight hits.

The Falcons collected nine hits. Hansen had two, including a double. Senior Angela Farr also had a double and two RBIs.
