

Thousands walk tomark Israel's 43rd birthday

The area Jewish community came out in force Sunday to pay tribute to Israel on its Argo birthay during the annual Walk for Israel in West Bloomfield.

More than 8,000 people participated in the 35-mile walk, which was sponsored by the Jewish Welfare Foundation and the Israel Independence Day Committee.
