Just because some jerk abuses atcohol and automobilies docan't mean we must all give up our automobiles or our ability to enjoy the beverage of our choice.



THE BRADY BILL mandates as even-day waiting period for the purchase of a handgun, but does not mandate a background check. That's an option of the local law enforcement agency. That's also a loophole for the criminal to aliphrough.

The Brady bill would burden law enforcement agencies by not providing the dollars needed for updated and accurate criminal records. What good is a background check if the records are not up to date?




