under city ordinance that prohibits the sale of liquor to minors. City or-dinance violation is a simple mis-demeanor carrying a maximum pen-alty of 80 days in Jail and \$500 line upon conviction in the 47th District upon conviction in the Court of Farmington.

The licensee, Hikmat Amine, will be reported to the Michigan Liquor Control Commission. The liquor con-

trol commission has the authority to levy stiff penalties as well as suspend or revoke liquor licenses.

In the last crackdown in Decem-er 1990, seven of the city's 41 bars and restappants licensed to sell alcohol were ticketed. That, until Wednesday's sting, represented the best record since the department began the undercover sweeps.


