THE RIGHT CHAIR

If you have arthritis, take care when purchasing furniture. For example, consider a chair. The chair seat should be no lower than 14 inches from the floor. This height allows you to arise using your knees in their optimum leveraged position and usually spares your shoulders and hands from the need to assist in getting up. Your chair should have a hard bottom to prevent you from sinking deeper into your seat when you start to move. The chair should have side arms that you can grip easily and on which you can position your elbows and shoulders when you must hold your legs on arising. Your chair should have a straight back. Then you can divide your seated weight in an equal manner between your shoulder blades and pelvis, a distribution that assists in arising. Using pillows as cushion or wedge between your lumbar spine and the back of the chair is a good idea. The difficulty comes in finding an accessory that both accommodates the contours of your body and the shape of the chair. Your option to shop a catalogue is limited, as you must sit in a chair before purchase. Also, because of your needs that persons without arthritis cannot understand, it is impractical for others to buy chairs or other furniture that you will use.
