

Goldstein wins again at horse show

Margie Goldstein registered a rare double Saturday at the wet and wild wind-up to the Detroit Horse Show.

Riding on Saluati II, Goldstein raced to victory in the \$50,000 Cadillac North American Grand Prix showcase event which highlighted the 14th annual Detroit Horse Show. Just a week earlier, Goldstein piloted that same horse to a triumph in the \$50,000 Crown Royal Motor City Grand Prix — the featured event of the Motor City Horse Show.

It marked only the second time the same rider and horse captured victories in the back-to-back horse shows hosted by the Bloomfield Open Hunt Club, Anthony Diamorbia, riding Sterling Image, did it in 1981.

But Saturday's triumph — Goldstein's fifth this season and 16th of her career — was especially satisfying for a number of reasons.

First, Goldstein holds a fondness for the BOH and many members have adopted her as kind of a "first daughter." Also, Goldstein is the American Grand Prix Association's spokesperson for Cadillac which annually shells out big bucks to sponsor the Detroit Horse Show.

And to win a jump-off for the second straight week is something she never could have predicted.

"I FEEL VERY fortunate and I feel very lucky," said Goldstein, who won \$44,000 for her various owners in the two major horse shows, including \$30,000 for her two wins.

"It's something you never really think could happen until you do it. It's real exciting to have it happen. And it means a lot to me because you have a great crowd here which kind of inspires you. And it meant that much more to me being that Cadillac was the sponsor here."

"I like Detroit. I like this ring. The atmosphere

and the people in Detroit here are great," she said. "And with weather like this you get a great crowd whereas in a lot of places they'd say forget it. So I do enjoy it here very much."

The 28-horse field began the competition on soggy turf from a day-long rain which had turned to a slight drizzle by the time the first horse hit the 13-gate course around 9 p.m. Midway through the event, the drizzle had subsided but ring conditions remained slick and tricky.

Despite the loose turf, 11 horses qualified for the jump-off with faultless rounds. The middle of the field seemed most in-tune with the course as, at one point, the riders qualified for the jump-off, including defending Cadillac North American Grand Prix champion Alice DeBany on The Natural.

Goldstein, the busiest rider of the night with four mounts, also earned a jump-off berth on Arisio. Beezie Patton, another veteran AGA rider, rode all three of her horses — Gusto Monroe, Schnapps and Northern Magic — into the jump-off.

The JUMP-OFF consisted of six fences, including one double jump. The cut-off time was 48 seconds.

Mandori, ridden by 21-year-old Erika Heintschel of Toledo, set the early standard with a faultless round timed at 35.979 seconds. Chris Kappler on Suleiman later rode through the course without a fault but fell just under a second short of Heintschel with a time of 36.924.

Saluati II, a 9-year-old Dutch-bred horse, then came up with another dandy performance for Goldstein. They flashed through the first part of the course easily enough, but got lucky in the final jumps as he hit two rails but both stayed up. Goldstein finished the fifth faultless round of the jump-off with a top time of 34.707 seconds.

Three riders remained, including two by Pat-

ton. However, each of the three had at least one fault which gave Goldstein the hard-earned Cadillac North American championship.

"The jump-off was difficult in that it was slippery from the weather," said Goldstein, the AGA's 1989 rider of the year. "We actually slipped twice out there on the last couple of jumps and we got lucky."

"He's a phenomenal horse . . . just unbelievable. The more you ask him the more he tries. He's just one in a million," she said. "He's a real flier and he goes in and gives his best effort every time in the ring. We just had a great couple of weeks here."

Goldstein won \$15,000 for first place, while Heintschel grabbed the second-place pot of \$11,000. Kappler was third on Suleiman and took home \$6,500.

"Margie's a great rider, and placing second here is nothing to be ashamed of," said Heintschel. "It feels like a big accomplishment."
