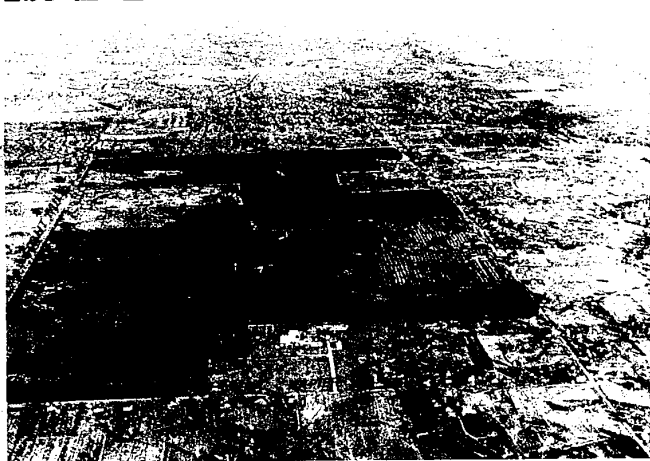


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These rolling hills in the northeast corner of Wayne County, once owned by the family of the Maybury Sanatorium and the care of those afflicted with tuberculosis for nearly a half-century, again may be put to use for the health and welfare of humankind through the establishment of a state park. The State Department of Natural Resources has planned to place a bid with the City of Detroit for purchase of the 868 acres of winding trails, long standing timber and other choice morsels for nature lovers. Wayne County is the only county in Michigan without a state park, and with its natural beauty, it is ideal for such things as a golf course, bicyclist diamonds, etc. It lacks a lake, but plans are afoot to build one if the deal is consummated.
