That willingness could eventually lead to as much as \$70 million in federal funds going toward easing congestion in Oakland.

As proposed in November, the road commission eventually hopes to computerize most of the major traffic arteries in Oakland at an expected cost of \$70-\$100 million.

Rather than constructing more and bigger highways, the road commission wants to case congestion by computerizing the roads, making it possible for various control centers to move the flow of traffic.

Similar systems have worked well in cities like Berlin, Germany and Sydney, Australia. And officials are convinced they can work here.

Joy said implementation of the smart highways in Troy has been delayed because of the complexity involved. "We're doing something new and different," he said. "And timetables are necessarily flexible."
