ing from remaining 1 cup of whipped cream, adding the vanilla and sweetening to taste. Spread on pie with decorative swirls or other pattern as desired. Sprinkle with chocolate shavings. Garnish with maraschino cherry in center of pie.

**APPLE CRISP PIE**  
Pastry for one 10-inch crust:  
1 1/4 cups all-purpose flour  
1/2 tsp salt (optional)  
1/4 cup shortening  
3-4 tablespoons cold water  
Heat oven to 425 degrees. Prepare pastry. Stir together the following: 1 cup sugar  
1/2 cup all purpose flour  
1 tsp. nutmeg  
1 tsp. cinnamon  
8 cups; thinly sliced, pared tart apples  
Fill pastry shell with the mixture. Crumb topping:  
1 cup all purpose flour  
1/4 cup firm butter  
1/4 cup packed brown sugar  
Mix until crumbly and place on top of apple mixture in pie shell. Bake 30 minutes. Cover the last 10 minutes with aluminum foil to prevent over browning.
