said Dale Weighill, president of the
school board for Clarenceville which
includes southeast Farmingon Hills
northeast Livouia, and northwest
Rediord Township.

After reaching agreement with its
teacher's union, the board Thursday
approved the seventh hour, which
should fall after lunch for most students.

IN ORDER to create the new hour and make room for four new pro-grams expected to be approved by the board next month, the district took minutes away from each of the

Livonia police seeking fatal accident witness

Police are seeking witnesses to a July 19 collision on Eight Mile Road that left a Farmington Hills woman dead and two others in-

"We know there were at least two more witnesses," said officer Arthur Chaney of the Livonia Po-lice department traffic bureau.

The investigation into the accident at Eight Mile and Farmington Road is continuing, Chaney said Monday.

Killed in the head-on collision was Weltha Jane Ramsey, 63.

Ramsey as waiting to make a left turn onto southbound Farmington shortly after 2 p.m. when her car was struck head on by an east-bound car that had crossed over the center line, police said.
That car had reportedly swerved to avoid hitting another vehicle.
The driver of the other car, a 43-year-old wisom woman, and her 33-year-old passenger were treated and released from St. Mary Hospital.


