

Oakland got most arts grants

The Michigan Council for the Arts has redistributed money from the poorest parts of the state to the richest, a conservative think-tank study says.

In 1981-82, artists in Oakland County, with Michigan's highest per capita income, received 46 arts council grants, the largest total of any county in the state, according to a study released today by the Mackinac Center, a Midland-based public policy think tank.

MCA distributed 83 grants to artists in Oakland and Washtenaw counties, which has the state's second-highest per capita income.

Artists in 74 of Michigan's 83 poorest counties received no grants from The Michigan Council for the Arts during a five-year period.

"BY REDISTRIBUTING tax dollars from poor and middle class to rich areas, the Michigan Council for the Arts has failed to serve the public interest," said Greg Kaza, the study's author. The group recommended abolishing the MCA.

Gov. John Engler last week reversed his decision to abolish the MCA, instead establishing a new group that will phase out grants over three years.

The MCA gave more than one-third of its total number of arts council grants to counties with less than one-seventh of the state population, said Kaza, vice president for

policy research at the Mackinac Center.

The Mackinac Center study recommended phasing out all state funding to the Detroit Institute of Arts, Detroit Symphony Orchestra, Michigan Opera Theatre and other cultural groups over a three-year period so that they are able to secure alternative funding from private and non-profit sources.

Engler takes the same position. He wants to eliminate operating grants, giving only capital funds.

"REFORM is necessary because there is no empirical evidence demonstrating that these state-funded organizations are serving the poor," Kaza said.

The State of Michigan can ill afford the arts council given the prevailing economic recession, budget crisis and the needs of middle-class taxpayers for property tax relief," Kaza said.

The 1981-1982 period was analyzed because it is the most recent time span for which figures are available, he said.

The 24 poorest counties which received no grants are: Lake, Keweenaw, Ogemaw, Baraga, Oscoda, Houghton, Presque Isle, Montmorency, Clare, Schoolcraft, Chippewa, Missaukee, Gogebic, Iron, Kalkaska, Osceola, Alcona, Iosco, Lapeer, Cheboygan, Arenac, Roscommon, Gladwin and Mackinac.

Area residents dominate MET board

Four residents of the Observer & Eccentric are among the five people Gov. John Engler has appointed to the Michigan Education Trust Board of Directors.

Richard Gabrys, of Bloomfield Hills, is the new president of the MET board. Dawn Phillips, of Birmingham, is vice president. Ronald Goldberry, Ph.D., of Bloomfield Hills, has been appointed to serve from the general public and John Lore, of Plymouth, is the nominee of the Speaker of the House.

The purpose of the board is to provide a method for families to save for their children's future Michigan college tuition costs.

Gabrys is associate managing partner of the Detroit Region of Deloitte & Touche Certified Public Accountants. He earned a bachelor of science degree in accounting from King's College in 1962 and became a Certified Public Accountant in Washington, D.C. in 1964 and in Michigan in 1969. Gabrys is a member

of the American Institute of CPAs, the Michigan Association of CPAs and the Financial Institutions Subcommittee. He serves the Board of Trustees for the Citizens Research Council of Michigan, and the Board of Directors of the Greater Detroit Chamber of Commerce and the Detroit Economic Growth Authority. Phillips replaces Richard Cole, of Haleslet and serves until another person is appointed by Engler.

PHILLIPS IS A partner in the law firm Phillips and Russell. She earned a bachelor of arts degree in English in 1966 from the University of Michigan and graduated cum laude in 1971 from the University of Michigan Law School where she earned a Juris Doctor degree. Phillips is a member of the American Bar Association, the Michigan State Bar Association and the Women Lawyers Association. Phillips replaces Don Davis, of Franklin. She serves until Engler appoints some-

one else.

Goldberry is executive director of Sales and Service Strategies for the Ford Motor Company. Goldberry earned a bachelor of science degree in chemistry from Central State University in 1964, and a master of science degree in chemistry in 1968 and a Ph.D. in inorganic chemistry in 1969 from Michigan State University. In 1973, Goldberry received an MBA in finance and marketing from Stanford University. He serves on the Board of Trustees of William Beaumont Hospital and is a member of the Cranbrook Educational Community. Goldberry is a member of both the Michigan State University Alumni Association and Black Alumni Association. He also serves on the Michigan State University Development Fund Board of Directors and is a trustee to the Rockefeller Foundation. Goldberry has been appointed to replace Donald Bemis, of Ulica, for a term ending Dec. 31, 1992.

Lore is senior vice president of the St. John Health Corporation and St. John Hospital and Medical Center in Detroit. From 1980 until 1986, Lore served as president of the Michigan Colleges Foundation and from 1975 until 1980, he served as president of Nazareth College. Lore earned a bachelor of science degree in printing management in 1965, a master of arts degree in higher education administration in 1967 and a doctor of education degree in 1975 from Western Michigan University. He is a member of the Development Committee of the United Community Services of Metro Detroit, serves on the Board of Directors of both the Starr Commonwealth Schools and the Detroit and Wayne County Family Services Board.
