A regular meeting of the Farmington City Council was called to order by Mayor Richardson at 8:00 p.m. on August 5, 1991, in Council Chambers, 28600 Farmington Street, Farmington, Michigan. Notice of the meeting was posted in compliance with Public Act 267-1976.

PRESENT: Hartsock, McShane, Richardson, Tupper, Yoder.
OFFICERS PRESENT: City Manager Deardrain, Director Laubach, Director Billings, City Attorney DeMouche, Admin. Assistant Smith, City Clerk Bushey.

Minutes of the previous meeting of July 15, 1991, were approved as written. Council held a Public Hearing to confirm the Special Assessment Roll, SAD #179, Parkland District, for the improvement of the area.

Council granted permission to the Salem United Church of Christ for use of the Memorial Park grounds on August 18, 1991.

Council opposed adoption of H.B. 6208 re: amendment to Wetland Protection Act. Council granted permission to the Farmington Rockets for use of the western baseball diamond in the area in Sharpsburg Park through October 25, 1991.

Section 1. That the land lying within the City of Farmington, Oakland County, Michigan, be rezoned as follows:

FROM R10 Family Farming TO R10 Family Office.

NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF ORDINANCE C-13-91, an Ordinance to amend the Farmington Hills City Code, Chapter 34, Zoning Chapter, Article XXII, Section 34-543(b) and Section 34-543(c), governing sign requirements, at a regular meeting held on August 12, 1991, and ordered publication of the following digest or summary of the Ordinance, in accordance with Section 4.04 of the City Charter. THE CITY OF FARMINGTON HILLS ORDAINS:

Section 1.
The City of Farmington Hills City Code, Chapter 34, Zoning Chapter, Article XXII, Section 34-543(b)(4), is hereby amended to read as follows:

(4) No accessory sign or nameplate, except nameplates relating to residential dwellings, shall be affixed to the exterior of a building until approved by the code enforcement officer, a fee paid and a permit issued. A new permit shall be required if such signs are relocated on the building or are increased in surface area or dimension. This provision shall not apply to those sale or lease signs permitted in subsection (c)(4).

Section 2.
The City of Farmington Hills City Code, Chapter 34, Zoning Chapter, Article XXII, Section 34-543(c)(3), is hereby amended to read as follows:

(3) No residential entranceway, freestanding accessory or non-accessory sign shall be erected or affixed to a building until approved by the code enforcement officer, a fee paid and a permit issued. A new permit shall be required if such signs are relocated on the ground or are increased in surface area or dimension. This provision shall not apply to residential nameplates permitted in residential zones or to those signs permitted in subsection (4) below.

The City of Farmington Hills City Code, Chapter 34, Zoning Chapter, Article XXII, Section 34-543(b)(1) is hereby amended as to Districts, Type of Wall Signs, Maximum Area in Square Feet with and without Freestanding Signs.

The City of Farmington Hills City Code, Chapter 34, Zoning Chapter, Article XXII, Section 34-543(b)(1), Notes to Wall Signs, shall be amended in the following subsections: (6), (7), (8), (12), (13), and (14).
