The Detroit Area Agency on Aging, Area Aging on Aging 1-B and the Senior Alliance all have programs where volunteers serve as counselors to older persons who have problems and questions concerning Medicare, Medicaid and Supplemental Security Insurance. This free service is sponsored by the area agencies and the American Association of Retired Persons. Older adults are assisted with concerns or questions re-

garding Medicare, Medicaid eligibil-ity, filing Medicare forms, Supple-mental insurance claims and appeals and hospital discharge poli-cies.

Courselors receive three days of intensive training, a training manual and follow-up assistance. Volunteers are placed at various sites within their communities and there is ongoing counselor support.
