Below are highlights from the agendas of government meetings this week. All meetings are open to the public.

The city council is expected to vote to go into executive session during the special meeting to discuss pending litigation involving Morris Associates, Northridge Associates and Providence Hospital. During the open part of the meeting, they will discuss the proposed Temporary Sign Ordinance Amendment, time permitting.

During the regular meeting, the council will hold three public hearings:

- consider vacating a 14-foot public utilities easement between Cadillac Ave. and Stocker Ave. in section 33.
- consider vacation of Power Road between Colfax and Eight Mile.
- consider a proposed amendment to the city code regarding farms in single family residential districts.

Under unfinished business, the council will again consider a consent judgment with Mel Kaftan. They will also consider enactment of an amendment allowing exemption from the city's recycling program and enactment of an ordinance regulating cats in the city. Ben Marks' proposal for an Orchard Lake Road association is on the agenda for discussion, as is the consideration of banner installation along the Orchard Lake corridor.

Under new business, the council will:

- consider an amendment to the city code dealing with temporary signs.
- consider a request to transfer ownership of a Class C liquor license from First Team, Inc. to Coaches Deli.
- consider approval of a final preliminary plat for Sinacola Woods subdivision, and approval of final plat for same.
- hear a report regarding a vacant house at 27864 Kendallwood.
- consider action on a resolution regarding proposed state gas tax increase.
- consider setting a date to meet with the Mercy Center administrative team.
- consider leasing additional space for the Senior Adult Program

at Mercy Center.

• consider adopting a resolution opposing state legislation for a Police Officers' Bill of Rights.
• consider appointing a voting delegate and alternate to the Annual Congress of Cities.
The city manager will suggest November ballot language for the proposed expansion of the 47th District Court and offer a recommendation to approve an amendment to the Articles of Incorporation of the City of Farmington Hills Hospital Finance Authority.

The council will consider bond proposal wording for district court expansion and also discuss amending the city's recycling ordinance to al-

low exemptions. They will also handle contractor payments for the city's sewer project, hard a public safety quarterly report and consider several resolutions and requests from city individuals and groups. The council is also expected to adopt a skateboarding ordinance.
Also on the agenda is a table request from Maple Pharmacy owner Al Wanger regarding a sign variance for his stores.
