Propose Limit On Negotiations

FARMINGTON  
A proposed limitation on the number of items to be negotiated in upcoming contract talks has been made to the Farmington Board of Education by the teachers' union.

EACH PARTY would be restricted to bringing no more than five proposals to the bargaining table, exclusive of pay and school calendar, according to a format submitted by Roger Allen, executive director of the

Farmington Education Assn. (FEA).

Neither the board nor its negotiations team has met yet to discuss the proposal, a spokesman said, but he is "sure the board will take it up at an early meeting." The present contract expires Aug. 31, and talks on next year's pact are due to get underway about April 20. Under the FEA plan, an entire contract article would be considered as a single proposal--provided it dealt with one central subject.

HOWEVER, an article such as "working conditions," which deals with a variety of subjects, would be considered a separate item for each subject opened for discussion.

"It was the feeling of many Farmington teachers that one of the factors that made resolution so difficult last year was the overwhelming number of proposals which had to be considered by the respective negotiating teams," Allen wrote the board.

"For this reason, it is the feeling of the Farmington Education Assn. that the limitations inherent in this proposal represent a constructive framework for the upcoming negotiations."

Teachers last year worked without a contract until Sept. 23 while a state fact-finder resolved unsettled differences involving salary scales, a fringe benefit program and supplementary pay schedules.

FARMINGTON  
William Mitchell was appointed to the city's planning commission Monday night by the Farmington City Council. He replaces James Platt, who resigned effective March 1 after accepting a job in South Carolina.

Mitchell, very active in the Farmington Area Jaycees, was nominated by Councilman John Richardson, supported by Councilman John Allen, and appointed by a unanimous vote. He lives in Chatham Hills subdivision. The planning commission has picked Commissioner Jesse McDonald to replace Platt on its downtown redevelopment subcommittee.

In another appointment Monday night, the council named Robert Bedore to the Farmington Youth Assistance Committee.

Bedore, a city auxiliary policeman, will represent the city on the committee which was formerly known as the Farmington Area Youth Guidance Committee.

The committee, chaired by the Rev. Hugh Stewart of St. Stephen Presbyterian Church, meets tonight (Wednesday) in the Farmington Community Center dining room.
