Township May Apply For State Park Funds

Farmington Township is in the process of applying for a \$100,000 grant from the state recreation bond issue approved by voters in November 1968.

The township must apply by April 1 before the balance of the \$100 million bond not appropriated is placed into a general fund with the bulk then expected to go to inner cities.

THE APPLICATION is being prepared by the parks study committee appointed a month ago by the township board.

A request to apply for the state funds was made at the last board meeting by two committee members, Herman Mohlman and Mrs. Betty Frankel.

A plan which will be submitted with the application calls for a \$120,000 recreation program with the state contributing 80% of the cost if approved.

The park committee was established at the Jan. 25

meeting of the board, and 12 residents, have been appointed members.

The state distributes recreation funds on the basis of high-population and low-income areas, Mohlman told trustees, and so the plan gives first priority to the southeast quadrant of the township.

THE FIRST phase the committee envisions is establishment of mini-parks in the southeast quadrant.

The committee is considering a three-acre site which has a large stone house on it which could be used as a teen center and for senior citizen activities.

Mohlman says St. Alexander Catholic Church might lease another parcel at \$1 a

year to the township for recreation use. The land is already developed for recreation and will only need supervision.

"The township will have one year after the application is approved to form a final recreation plan. If the program will involve substantial money, Mohlman adds, the committee would like to obtain a vote from residents.

"We don't have to accept the money, but to become eligible we must first apply," he added. Mohlman stressed the plan submitted was only for use in making the application and was not binding upon the township.

A status report on the state application should be made at the March 22 township board meeting.
