Campbell is a quality associate in the Corporate Quality Office of Ford Motor Co., and is married with two sons.







He served as mayor in 1979 and in 1985. He lives on Cass Street. Just ending her first term, McShane is already organizing her campaign, which she expects to be similar to the one that won her a seat in 1989.

"Mine is just kind of a grass-roots, people-to-people campaign," said the 5-year-old account executive with Horace Mann Insurance.

The 65-year-old veteran council-man was, at first, unsure of whether he would run again after 26 years on the council. But, he said, he decided to go ngain after family and support-ers urged him to do so. Yoder, who often brings a sense of history to feuer arking at the coun-

history to issues arising at the coun-cil table, said he wants to continue

In winning his most recent term in 1987. Yoder sought re-election because of a "continuing interest" in the city and "the improvements that can be made in keeping our city the attractive and well-governed city that it has been for many years."

The former mayor could not be reached for comment on this year's race, but has pledged to spend much of his time in Farmington this winter, despite his retirement and time spent in Florida with his wife.

Voder is a retired trucking company executive and has two grown children. He is a 32-year resident of Farmington, graduating from Farmington High in 1947.

Also on the Farmington ballot this November will be an issue asking outers to approve \$175,000 in general obligation bonds, to be used to derray Farmington's share of expanding and renovating the 47th District Court to accommodate the addition of a third judge.
