## OCC, library explore merger for new facility

bility, Jaksen said.

Papal says she sees the possibility of cost savings. With a merged library there would be no duplication of part of the book collections, journal subscriptions and microfilms. Operating costs could be shared as well as joint costs for the introduction of new technology.

"Technology is expensive. If we can jointly add technological services we can do that more efficiently than alone," Papal said.

Papal and Jaksen are also faced with how — If there is a merger — electronic equip-

ment, personnel and other library functions and systems would be integrated.

Other issues that still need to be explored include location within the Orchard Ridge campus so any new library is accessible to students and the public. Papal also is committed to maintaining the character of a public library.

Also on tap are discussions about ownership and governance of such a cooperative venture, as well as site. The Farmington Community Library still needs 80,000 square feet. It's unknown what OCC's size requirements are but it's got to be decided how much space can be

shared, Jaksen said.

"We have to find out how much the plans change to address the OCC needs," Papal said. "What kind of study spaces do students need that's unique from a public library?"

OTHER COMMUNITY colleges and public libraries have merged in the past in Montana, Arkansas, Tennessee, Texas and Florida.

"A strong role and stronger service have to be the key," Papal said.

In addition to possible cost savings, Papal believes a merger would offer the public and students a stronger collection.

Consider that OCC-Orchard Ridge focuses

on business and liberal arts. The Farmington Community Library also has a strong business focus and with its collection also focuses on liberal arts, Papal said.

Also consider that 40 percent of the tax base is from the business community. And according to data provided by Norhaus Research more than 40 percent of adults who use the Farmington Community Library do so for professional reasons.

"There's an obvious advantage to both of us looking at the overall strength of our services to the same targeted segment of the community," Papal said.

A tree design will be the link in a community quilt which will commemorate the 125th anniversary of Farmington as a village.

The quilt design, to be worked on during the fall and winter months by a corps of volunteers, will include 12 patchwork and applique blocks on

the tree and 10 embroidered half-blocks on the quilt's edge.

About 20 residents of Farmington and Farmington Hills have volunteered to work on the quilting project.

Some of the local topics to be detailed on the quilt include: the Bois-

ford Inn with plank road and stagecoach, the downtown Masonic Temple, the area's Indian trails, a map of Farmington and a Gov. Fred Warner campaign button.

The finished quilt will be presented next spring and will hang in

Farmington City Hall.

The quilt effort is being chaired by Carol Kurth. Mayor Shirley Richardson, who is coordinating the 125th Anniversary celebration, said volunteers will work on the squares this fall, and the quilt will be put together during the winter months.
