The theater was designed by Detroit architect Marcus Burrowes and features an amphitheater, stage and platforms on each side of the stage in front of a large swimming pool.

It was designed along classic Greek architectural lines and was

patterned after an ancient theater in Sieily. Over the years, however, Michigan's weather took a heavy toil on the theater and in the mid-1980s it had deteriorated to the point it was taken off the Cranbrook Gardens tour.
