# Woman suspect in contract killing

Michigan State Police are looking for a West Bloomfield woman who has been charged by a California court with conspiracy to commit murder in the 1980 slaying of her husband by a contract killer.

New evidence in the 11-year-old case led a Santa Clara County judge to issue an arrest warrant for Judith Ann Barnett, 44, also known as Jud-

ith Witkin and Judith Singer.

"We believe she's still in the area," State police Lt. Chris Hogan said. "We talked to an awful lot of people that are related to her or know her," but none of them can, or will, tell police where Barnett is.

"In spite of direct requests to (Barnett's) attorney and family members, she has not surrendered and it appears she has gone in hiding to avoid arrest," a press release said. WEST BLOOMFIELD POLICE officers are also looking for Barnett. But Lt. Dah Pitsos said it won't be easy to find her.

"She can disappear into the wood-work," Pitsos said. "Not too many women in their 40s are wanted for murder. If she rents a car you'll nev-er find her."

Hogan said the hit man who killed Howard Witkin was convicted of the crime initially. Then the conviction was overturned. Then there was a

pleaded "no contest" to a lesser things.
Sania Clara County criminal investigator Sandra Williams flew to Michigan Friday to help state police locate Barnett, but would not return the Eccentric's calls.
