Local photographer has exhibit in New York City

An exhibition of 23 new photographs by Karen Nederlander of Franklin continues at Multi Media Arts Gallery, 594 Broadway Suite 309 (between Houston and Prince streets), New York City through Saturday, Sept. 28.

The new collection is similar to her impressionist photographs published in 1988, but it is presented in diptychs — each assembled in a floating lucite frame.

Nederlander said she developed her distinct camera technique — joining motion with color to achieve a painterly illusion — by taking her photographs from a car or train, while walking or on horseback.

"I call my pictures impressionist photographs," she said.
