Christopher Noth observes 'Law & Order'

First there was *Car 54, Where Are You?*, which made America laugh at the antics of two bumbling cops. Then *Adam 12* gave TV a more realistic shot. The public loved the human drama of *Hill Street Blues*, but the down-and-dirty side of the streets was often missing.  
Now there's *Law & Order*, a new intense, hour-long show filled with cops, thieves and lawyers. On the front line is Christopher Noth, playing hardened but human police detective Mike Logan.  
The son of former CBS News reporter Jeanne Parr, Noth was born in Madison, Wis., raised in England, Yugoslavia, Spain and Connecticut before attending Yale School of Drama. After Yale, the darkly debonair actor portrayed Hamlet at the American Shakespeare Festival in Connecticut and

went on to featured roles in theaters from coast to coast.  
Noth appeared on television in the miniseries *I'll Take Manhattan*, the NBC movie *Killer in the Mirror* and *Hill Street Blues*. His big screen career includes roles in *Off Beat*, *Smithereens* and *Baby Boom*.

Before undertaking his role on *Law & Order*, Noth decided to get the facts about being a cop by observing detectives of New York City's 34th Precinct, which has the highest homicide rate of any precinct in Manhattan, N.Y.
