

Fall community education classes begin

The Farmington Community School is gearing up for a new season of academic courses, lecture and enrichment classes for all ages through the Farmington Public Schools Community Education Department.

From computers to acrobatics, pre-school tumbling to high school basketball courses, community education has something to offer everyone. Brochures were recently mailed to all area residents. Copies can be obtained by calling the Farmington Community School at 489-3333.

Weekdays. Classes begin the week of Sept. 23. Classes this fall include basic keyboarding skills, a session on developing work skills, learning to cook small meals for one or two people, or getting hands-on lessons in making door decorations from dried flowers and herbs. Courses on Great Lakes sport fishing, constitutional law video production and computer aided design are also on this fall's class list. Want to learn to care a chair? Bring a refinishing chair to a chair caning class and do your own.

Daytime and evening baby-sitting service is available for those attending classes at the Community School.

SENIOR ADULTS aged 60 or over are offered several special classes. They are eligible for one free registration except in limited enrollment classes, and a Senior Adult Card issued by the school district entitles them to attend high school concerts, home athletic events and other school activities free of charge.

The Farmington High School media center will again be open Saturday mornings from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m., so residents and students can make use of the facility. Resources include electronic reference sources, computer work stations, and a multimedia sandbox which combines many forms of media for production purposes.

This Ordinance was adopted at a regular meeting held on September 16, 1991, and ordered publication of the following summary of the Ordinance, in accordance with Section 4.04 of the City Charter. THE CITY OF FARMINGTON HILLS ORDAINS:

Section 1.
The City Code of the City of Farmington Hills, Chapter 34, Zoning, Article III, One-Family Residential Districts, Section 34-52, Principal Uses Permitted in the R1A Districts, Subparagraph (2) only, is hereby amended to read as follows:

(2) Farms subject to the following:

- Buildings to house animals such as dairy and/or beef cattle, sheep, goats, or pigs shall not be located within two hundred (200) feet of any property line.
- Buildings to house animals such as fowl or rabbits shall not be located within seventy-five (75) feet of any property line.

NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF ORDINANCE C-16-91, an Ordinance to amend the Code of Ordinances, City of Farmington Hills, Michigan, by amending Article II, Dogs, of Chapter 6, Animals, to regulate cats within the City. This Ordinance was adopted at a regular meeting held on September 16, 1991, and ordered publication of the following summary of the Ordinance, in accordance with Section 4.04 of the City Charter. Printed copies of the full text of the ordinance are available for inspection and distribution to the public at the office of the City Clerk.

THE CITY OF FARMINGTON HILLS ORDAINS:

Section 1. The following sections of Chapter 6, Animals, Article II, Dogs, of the City Code have been amended:
Article II, DOGS AND CATS
6-31. Definitions.
6-32. Yards, Exercise Runs, Sanitation.
6-33. Licensing, Vaccination.
6-34. Confinement, Control.
6-36. Number of Dogs and Cats.

The following new sections have been added:

6-37. No person owning, harboring, keeping or in charge of any dog or cat shall cause, suffer, or allow such dog or cat to soil, defile, defecate or to commit any nuisance on public thoroughfare, sidewalk, passageway, bypass, play area, park, or any place where people congregate or walk, or upon any public property whatsoever, or upon any private property without permission of the owner of said property unless:

(a) The person who so owns, harbor, keeps or is in charge of such dog or cat shall immediately remove all droppings deposited by such dog or cat by any sanitary method. The person shall possess a container of sufficient size to collect and remove above mentioned droppings and exhibit the container, if requested by any official empowered to enforce this article.

(b) The droppings removed from the aforementioned areas shall be disposed of by the person owning, harboring, keeping, or in charge of such dog or cat in a sanitary method on the property of the person owning, harboring or in charge of said dog or cat.

6-38. Remedy. Any owner of a cat that is unable to keep the cat on their own premises due to the nature of the animal, shall accept as their full responsibility, the cost of any damage to any other persons private or public property.
