Lisa Neda, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Paul Neda of 32334 Hearststone, Farmington Township, has achieved a typing certificate. She can type 100 to 105 wpm in the one-minute tests and at least 90 wpm on five-minute tests.

Lisa is a ninth grader at O.E. Dunckel Junior High School. She does not own a typewriter and the only practice she gets is in Mrs. E. Lamos' typing class at the school. Lisa will come into the typing room at least two or three hours daily and practice.

Her typing includes school assignments and special work for the teachers at the school. All in all, Lisa had about eight months of typing instruction. Before her family moved to Farmington, Lisa had had a few classes for one-half semester at Abbott Jr. High in West Bloomfield. This fall she enrolled in the full year of typing and typed about 35 to 40 wpm on three minute tests.

MRS. ELEANOR Lamos, who is her present teacher, has only experienced one other such achievement by a young person in her eight and half years of teaching typing. Lisa plans to pursue a career in business and typing and at present is an honor roll student. She is one of five children in the Neda household which include: Carol, who lives in Paris, Marty's student at Eastern; Tara is at University of Michigan and Tammy is in the eighth grade at O.E. Dunckel.
