Road project at 12 Mile nearly done

The 12 Mile boulevard project in Farmington Hills is nearing completion, with some of the final tasks slated to begin this week.

According to David Call, Farmington Hills assistant city manager, contractors are scheduled to complete pedestrian lighting and do some minor clean-up for the project.

Several sections of pavement which are unacceptable are also scheduled to be repaired, he said. Those areas include the intersections at White Plains and Bunker Hill, and also random areas of curbing in the new median. "We didn't want people to be concerned about why we're digging up the new pavement," he added. "They were unacceptable, and we wanted to get the repairs done while the work was under warranty."

The work is expected to take one to two weeks, Call said. Letters have been sent to nearby homeowners and to neighborhood associations.

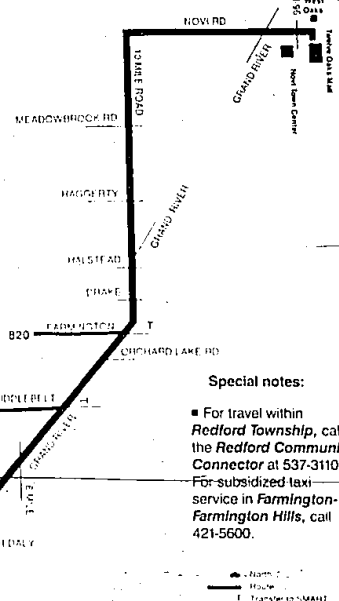
