### 'Newton's Apple' looks at Olympic training

 Newton's Apple, the Emmy Award-winning PBS family science series, begins its ninth season this week with

an informative and entertaining half-hour special, "The Science of Olympic Sports." The episode airs Saturday, Oct. 5, on most PBS affiliates.

Host David Heil and field reporter Peggy Knapp take viewers to the United States Olympic Training Centers in Colorado Springs, Colo., and Lake Placid, N.Y., where each year between six and eight thousand athletes combine training and technology in pursuit of the single-minded goal of representing the United States in the Olympic Games.

In the opening segment, Knapp lumbers around a running track while physiologist Jay T. Kearney explains how a volume-of-oxygen mask measures the chemical efficiency of a runner's lungs. Then, Heil takes a turn in a swimming flume to demonstrate various ways cameras and computers are used to dissect and analyze a swimmer's technique. In quick succession, the show touches on training advances in weightlifting, racewalking, softball and the luge.

Despite all the technological ad-

vances, it is mental preparation that most often decides which competitor takes home the gold medal and which is just an "also-ran." Heil and Knapp address this aspect in a conversation with Olympic Training Center psychologist Shane Murphy. TV & movie
