All who are interested in the new school in District No. 1 and Fractional District No. 1 and District No. 2, should be at the town hall at Farmington, Wednesday evening, January 6.

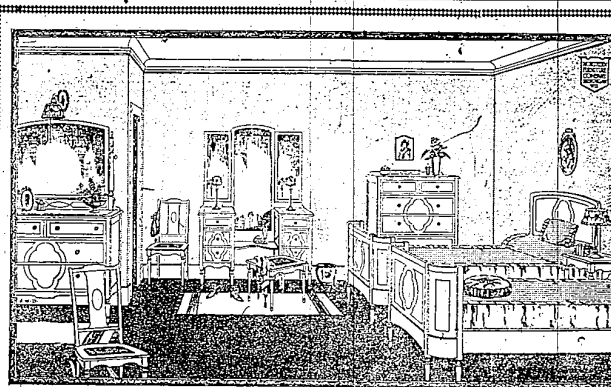
