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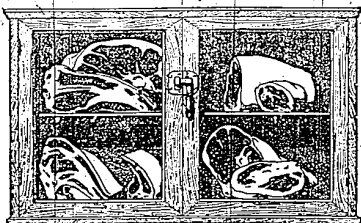

"DESIRE UNDER THE ELMS" RETURNS TO GARRICK

"Desire Under the Elms," Eugene O'Neill's great drama of a lonely New England farm, where all the basic passions of humanity are unleashed, will return to the Garrick Theatre in Detroit, Sunday, January 31 for an engagement of one week with two matinees, Wednesday and Saturday. This is the original company of distinguished players, which were seen for 49 weeks in New York and came to Detroit earlier in the season.

The cast of "Desire Under the Elms," is headed by Mary Morris, the talented O'Neill protege who plays Abbit Putnam, the beautiful new wife brought to the farm; Robert Harrison who enacts Ephraim Cabot, the stern old farmer; and Charles Ellis as Eben Cabot, the young lover whose passion leads to tragedy. The presentation is made by the Provincetown Players, of the Greenwich Village Theatre, New York, where "Desire Under the Elms" was first produced.

Eugene O'Neill has written some very striking plays, with a power of originality and a touch of genius that has caused him to be proclaimed a dramatist of American origin that compares favorably with the best of the European continent. Author of "Anna Christie," "The Hairy Ape," "Beyond the Horizon" and "Emperor Jones," he never wrote a play that caused such a storm of discussion as "Desire Under the Elms." The language has a biting realism and the dramatic scenes are tense with power.

The return to Detroit of this play is an eventful one for lovers of the best in modern dramatic offerings. The production is an unique and unusual one, as an entire farmhouse of four rooms is built upon the stage, and the action takes place in the kitchen, bedrooms and parlor. It will take seven hours to erect this set upon the stage of the Garrick Theatre.

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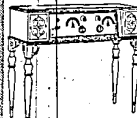
