WITH a conviction that part of his business was to saw regu-larly, Abraham Lincoln stayted a bank account at the earliest possible noment in his life.

Back of this determination to save was the experience of the first 23 years of his life, years of hard labor, when produce, and not cash, was the reward of his industry with the ax. When he married at the age of 34, his income from the law was about \$25 a week. The General Store which outfitted his home also served as his bank.

In spite of small earnings, he always managed to keep a little ahead of the game. In spite of maderate charges for his services—he always managed to save something.

As we honor Lincoln for his sterling Americanism, his great, tender heart, his courage and his vision—let us remember, too, that he built an estate through industry and thrift.


